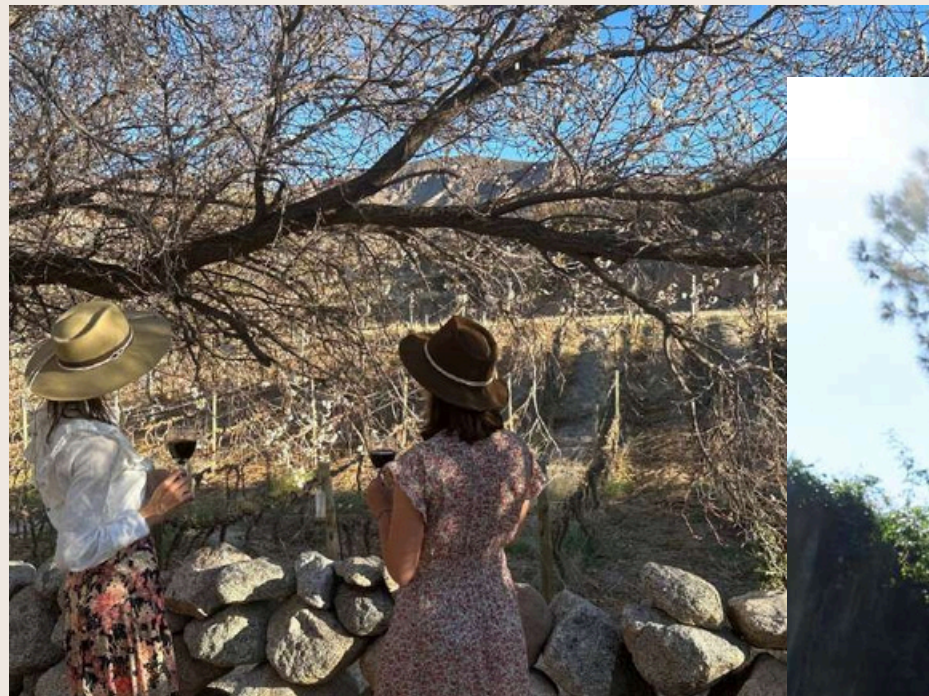

Loma Larga

Rapsodia 2012

Loma Larga is a family-owned winery perched on a long hill in Chile's Casablanca Valley, just 18 miles from the Pacific Ocean. Known for its cool climate whites, the valley is an unlikely home for reds—yet Loma Larga was the first to prove it possible.

This 2012 blend features syrah in the lead, with malbec and cabernet franc adding complexity. On the nose, it's classic Chile—herbal and fresh. The palate delivers bold plum and blackberry, with that green, herbal lift returning on the finish.

The Vineyards

Just 18 miles from the Pacific, Loma Larga's hillside vineyards in Chile's cool-climate Casablanca Valley are uniquely suited for red varieties. Their sun-exposed micro-terroir allows syrah, malbec, and cabernet franc to thrive, producing vibrant, hand-harvested wines with structure and freshness.

Casado Morales

EME Mazuelo 2015

Winemaker Joseba Casado's family has been making wines along the Ebro River in Rioja for a century; the modern incarnation of their Casado Morales winery dates back to the 1960s.

A 100% mazuelo (known in France as carignan) is rare in Rioja. Ten years ago even they were non-existent. With this 2015 from winemaker Joseba Casado, perhaps Riojan mazuelo is ready to take first chair.

In this bottle you'll find a bounty of blueberries, wild herbs, summer flowers, and spice in the nose; then a good body (not too big) on the palate, where juicy blueberry and flowers take the fore.

The Vineyards

Nestled in Rioja Alavesa at 1,400 feet, the vineyard sits on lime-clay soils scattered with pebbles and gravel. This diverse terroir, combined with 32-year-old vines and traditional farming, delivers rare 100% Mazuelo with bold character and a touch of altitude.

Dominio de Freneza

La Voja Pinot Noir

Dominio de Freneza is a young winery, with its first harvest in 2020. La Voja is made primarily from Dijon 777 Pinot Noir clones (85%) sourced from 20-year-old vineyards in San Patricio del Chañar, Neuquén. The remaining 15% comes from massal selections in Mainque, Río Negro, where vines range from 40 to 75 years old.

Crafted with a traditional, low-intervention approach, the wine spends 9 months in used French oak. It shows a ruby red color, initially mineral and austere, then opens to reveal aromas of spice, blueberries, strawberries, and fine herbs—offering a pure expression of its Patagonian terroir.

The Vineyards

Hand-harvested from two distinct sites in Patagonia, Argentina—20-year-old Dijon 777 vines in Neuquén and 40–75-year-old massal selections in Río Negro—La Voja captures the region’s high-altitude freshness and deep varietal character.

Valle Arriba

Mayuco Malbec 2022

Deep in Argentina's desert (and deserted) Calchaquí Valleys, a river called Mayuco feeds a few acres of thick, dark malbec grapes. The Calchaquí desert, dry and extremely high altitude, is a harsh environment where old malbec vines grow on their original rootstock under hot, harsh sun and chilly nights. Here winemaker Raúl Dávalos continues a family tradition 200 years old, producing handmade, unfiltered, critically acclaimed wines with an astonishing depth of flavor and soaring antioxidant levels. Nose of fresh berry with a spicy kick. Let it aerate a moment, and you'll find velvety tannins & hints of dark chocolate on the palate. Cellar 1-10 years.

The Vineyards

High in the Calchaquí Valley desert, Malbec vines grow on original rootstock under intense sun and cold nights. This extreme terroir creates bold, antioxidant-rich grapes—hand-harvested and sustainably farmed for pure, high-altitude expression.
