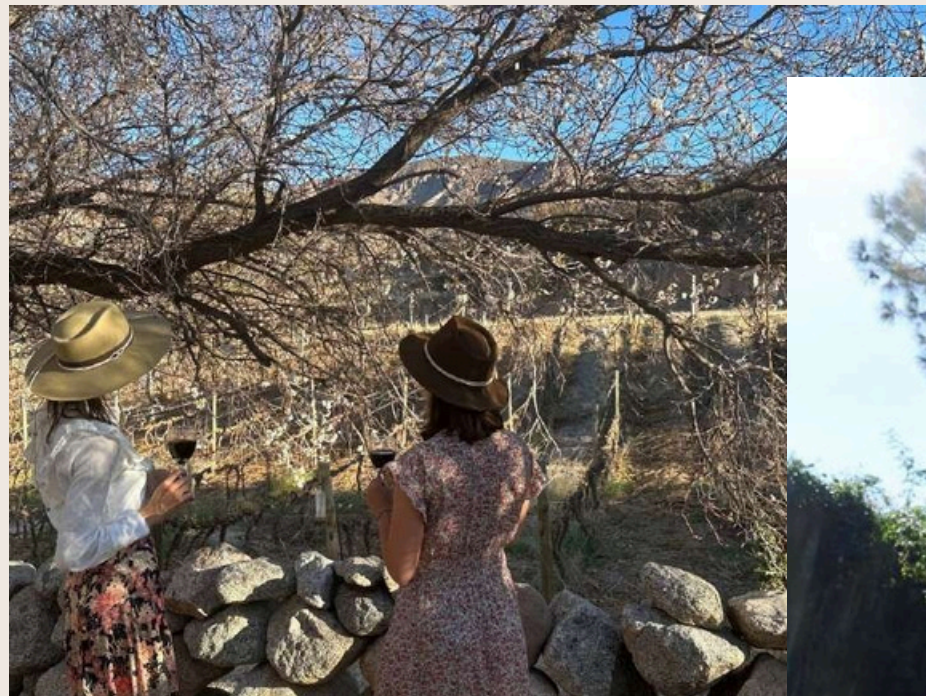

Casarena, Owens Single Vineyard Cabernet Sauvignon, 2018

In 2007, a group of friends began restoring an old sandstone winery from the 1930s in Luján de Cuyo, Mendoza, Argentina. Owen's vineyard is one of the oldest on their property. Planted in 1933, it offers an astonishing variety of soils in a relatively small area, allowing winemaker Leandro Azin to make a well-balanced blend from these 82-year-old cabernet sauvignon vines.

The Vineyards

A striking variety of soils that change every few meters, which allows a great work of micro-terroir. Move from an extremely clayey and deep profile, to shallow boulders mixed with sand and clay, and finally a profile dominated by boulders, unusually calcareous and with a high minerality.

Eric Poli, Clos Alivu, Patrimonio Rouge 2018

Clos Alivu Rouge is the personal project of Eric Poli, one of Corsica's most respected vigneron, rooted in the historic hills of Patrimonio. Crafted from old vines planted on terraced slopes overlooking the Mediterranean, this red captures the island's wild elegance and sunlit intensity. Nielluccio, Corsica's signature grape with genetic ties to Sangiovese, delivers freshness and finesse rather than brute power, shaped by maritime breezes and limestone-rich soils. The wine is expressive yet restrained, with a natural balance that reflects Poli's hands-off, essentially organic approach and deep connection to the land.

The Vineyards

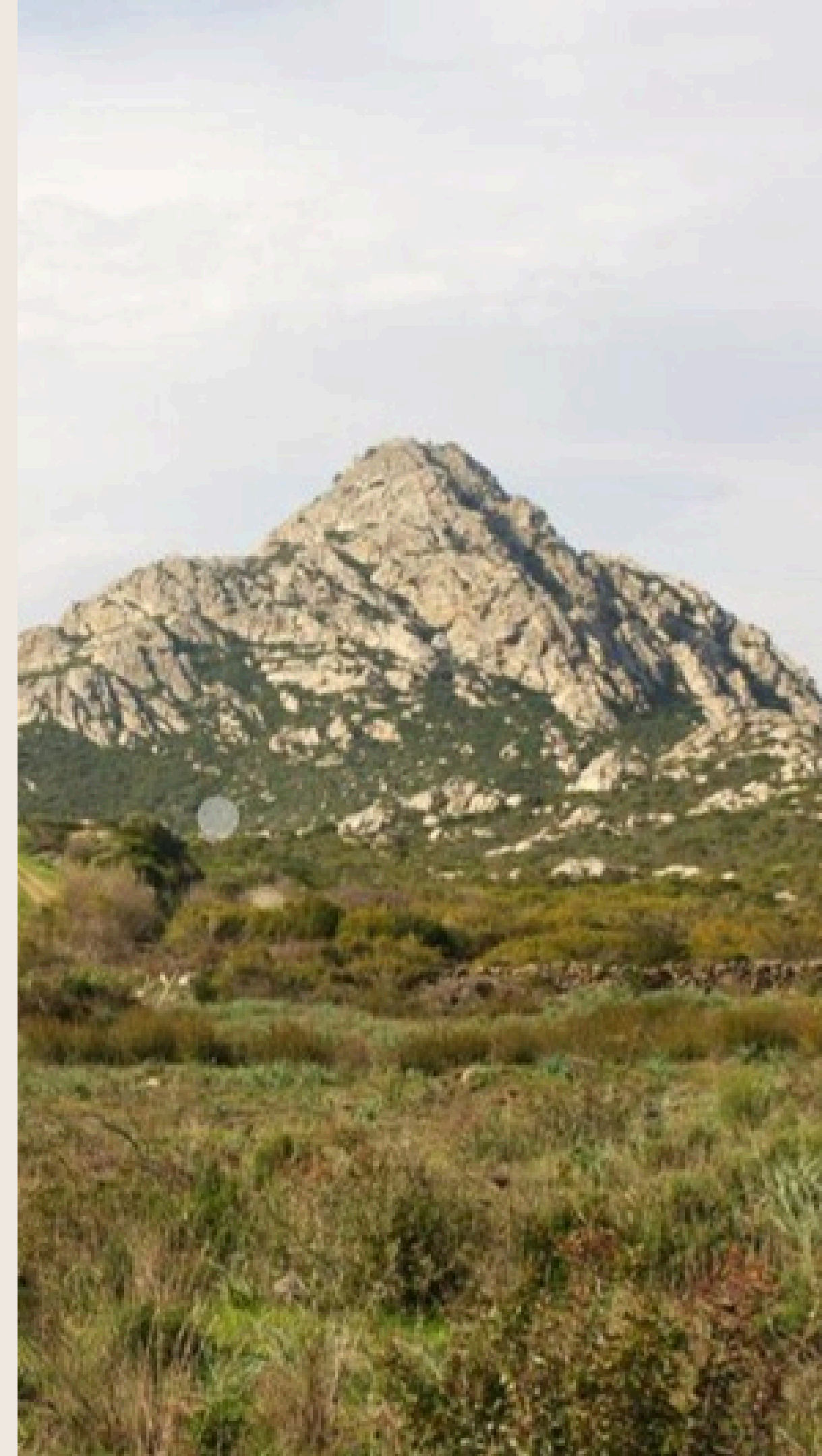
Sourced from 50+ year-old vines grown on terraced hillsides in Patrimonio, Corsica's oldest appellation. The soils are a rare local mix of limestone, clay, and schist known as Petra Bianca, protected by cooling maritime influences from the Gulf of Saint-Florent.

Notes

- Old vines (50+ years)
- Limestone, clay, and schist soils (Petra Bianca)
- Organic, Hand-harvested

Pair With:

Grilled lamb, herb-roasted chicken, Mediterranean stews, charcuterie, aged sheep's milk cheeses.





Château Lalande-Poitevin, GRAVES Rouge/Red 2018

Château Lalande-Poitevin Rouge 2018 is a classic Graves red shaped by gravelly soils and thoughtful winemaking. The wine opens with deep garnet color and an expressive profile driven by ripe red and black fruits, subtle spice, and a touch of tobacco. A portion of aging in French oak adds richness and polish without overpowering the fruit. On the palate, it is generous and smooth, with silky tannins and a long, fruit-forward finish that reflects both elegance and balance.

The Vineyards

Sourced from the Quebrada de San Lucas in the Calchaquí Valley, at nearly 6,900 feet above sea level. The calcareous soils and pure water from the Andes, together with wild herbs and native trees, create one of Argentina's most distinctive terroirs.

- Hand harvested
- 100% Malbec
- Cellar: 1–7 years

Grilled lamb, empanadas, roasted vegetables, aged cheeses.





Valle Arriba, La Criollita, Criolla Chica, 2020

High in the far north of the Calchaquí Valley, between 6,500 and nearly 10,000 feet above sea level, lie the remote micro-valleys known as Valle Arriba. Here, sixth-generation Salta winemaker Raúl Dávalos works small, carefully studied parcels to express one of Argentina's most historic grapes: Criolla Chica. La Criollita is both a tribute and a challenge. Traditionally associated with lighter, simple wines, Criolla Chica is reimaged here as something precise, expressive, and ageworthy. Bright, lifted, and quietly complex, this wine captures the delicacy of the grape while grounding it firmly in high-altitude character.

The Vineyards

Sourced from vineyards at 6,500 feet above sea level near Río Molinos, where sandy soils mixed with lime and granite meet intense sunlight and wide day-night temperature shifts. These extreme conditions preserve freshness, aromatic intensity, and natural tension in the fruit.

- 6,500 ft elevation
- 100% Criolla Chica
- Old vines (avg. 80 years)
- Hand-harvested
- Only 3,000 bottles

Pair With:

Tapas, anchovies, crostini, hard cheeses, charcuterie.
