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Dominio de Frenza

La Voja Pinot Noir

Dominio de Frenza is a young winery, with its first harvest dating back to 2020. La Voja is crafted primarily from Dijon 777 Pinot Noir clones (85%) sourced from 20-year-old vineyards in San Patricio del Chañar, Neuquén. The remaining 15% comes from massal selections in Mainqué, Río Negro, where the vines range from 40 to 75 years old. Made using a traditional, low-intervention approach, the wine is aged for nine months in used French oak barrels. It displays a bright ruby-red color, opening with mineral and austere notes before revealing aromas of spice, blueberries, wild strawberries, and fine herbs, offering a pure expression of Patagonia's unique terroir.

The Vineyards

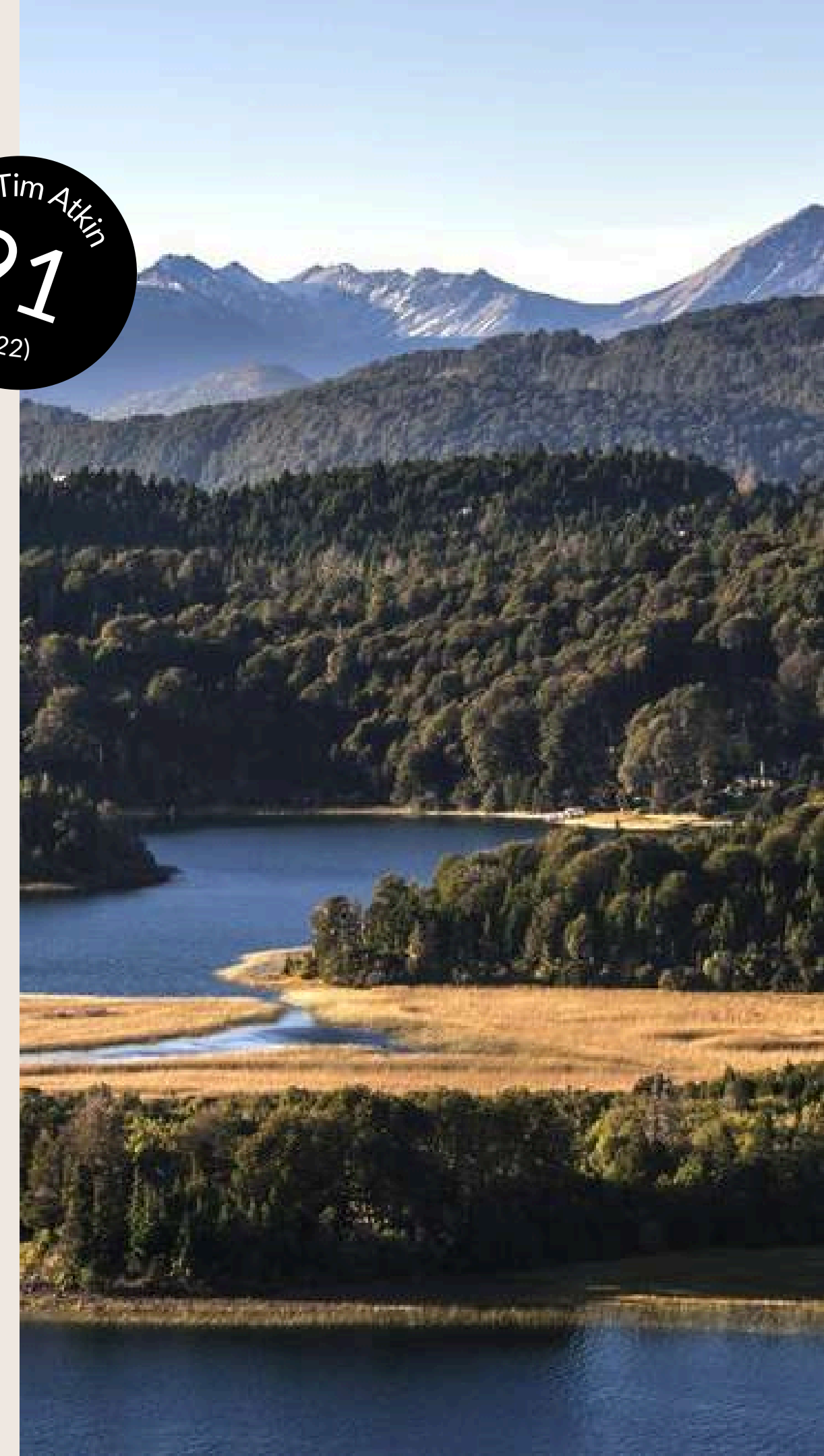
Hand-harvested from two distinct sites in Patagonia, Argentina—20-year-old Dijon 777 vines in Neuquén and 40–75-year-old massal selections in Río Negro—La Voja captures the region's high-altitude freshness and deep varietal character.

Saint Estephe-Chateau, Leo De Prades 2016

Château Léo de Prades 2016 comes from Saint-Estèphe, one of Bordeaux's most renowned appellations. Legend says the vineyard once belonged to the Marquis Léopold de Prades before being restored by the Marquis de Saint-Estèphe cooperative in 1999. Sourced from vines averaging over 70 years of age and aged 24 months in oak, this blend of Merlot, Cabernet Sauvignon, and Cabernet Franc offers aromas of dark fruit, tobacco, toasted coffee, and clove, with refined tannins and remarkable depth. Gold Medal winner at the Concours de Mâcon.

The Vineyards

Located in Saint-Estèphe, Bordeaux, these old vineyards grow on gravel over deep clay soils. The cool maritime climate and challenging terroir produce structured wines with remarkable aging potential.

Roasted lamb, grilled ribeye, duck confit, or aged Comté.





LaMadrid, Gran Reserva Malbec 2021

Lamadrid Estate wines are born from a delicate balance between the work at the vineyard and the vinification process. This beautiful and age-worthy expression of classic malbec comes from the 90 year-old Matilde vineyard. It takes 3 vines to make just 1 bottle. Deep purple. Lavender, plum, blueberry, tobacco and licorice on the nose. Medium-bodied with silky tannins and a juicy palate. Fresh and fruity.

The Vineyards

The soils in Agrelo are generally sandy loam with a deeper layer of gravelly stones, made up from eroded, mineral-rich material from the Andes. Temperature variation is the key aspect of the terroir, extending the ripening period and balancing crisp acidity and complex flavors in the grapes. Altitude 3,300 feet.

Leda Mas de Leda 2018

In northwestern Spain, on the plains of what was once the Kingdom of Old Castile, the Masaveu family (winemakers since the 1800s), produce limited batch, high quality wines with an obsession on soil. Their partner, Mariano Garcia, is a “Master of Duero” – Spanish aficionados will know him from Vega Sicilia. The winery, Leda, lies just outside Ribera’s boundaries, nestled between it and the smaller Toro region to the west. This 2018 (organic, dry farmed, indigenous yeast) combines grapes from both regions to create an incredible expression of tempranillo with a red fruit and balsamic nose and a long silky finish on the palate.



The Vineyards

Multi-terroir-sourcing, from small plots of tempranillo averaging less than 2.5 acres each. The vineyards are planted in poor, deep soils and produce very light yields. Though these vines are constantly monitored, little intervention is given, & only natural farming methods are used.

- Old vines (average age 50 years)
- Organic
- Dry farmed
- Indigenous yeast
