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Tenuta Vallocaia Bindella

Vino Nobile di Montepulciano

Bindella is the flagship wine of Tenuta Vallocaia and a classic expression of Vino Nobile di Montepulciano DOCG, one of Italy's most historic appellations. Produced primarily from Sangiovese, this wine is aged 22 months in large oak barrels followed by two years in bottle, allowing its structure to soften while developing remarkable complexity. The nose opens with herbal notes before revealing blackcurrant, cassis, and fresh blackberry. On the palate, vibrant berry flavors, balanced acidity, and refined tannins create an elegant, age-worthy wine.

Awarded 94 points by Luca Maroni and 91 points by James Suckling.

The Vineyards

The vineyards of Montepulciano grow on sandy soils with clay and silt under a Mediterranean climate. Cool mountain air from the Apennines slows ripening, preserving freshness and complexity.

- Vino Nobile di Montepulciano DOCG
- 22 months in large oak barrels
- Predominantly Sangiovese
- Hand harvested

Pair With:

Braised beef, wild mushroom risotto, roasted lamb, or aged Pecorino.





Le Vie Angarano “*Quare*” 2019

Born in the historic Villa Angarano, a UNESCO World Heritage Site designed by Palladio, Quare 2019 is a rare and expressive Cabernet Sauvignon. Crafted by the Bianchi Michiel sisters with renowned winemaker Marco Bernabei, it comes from low-yield vines on alluvial-clay soils in Veneto. Aged 24 months in French oak beneath vaulted ceilings, this limited release of just 3,500 bottles reveals ruby-red hues, aromas of crushed pepper and red fruits, and a palate that balances warmth, tannic grip, and long persistence. The Vineyards

Nestled in Breganze DOC at 120m elevation, the 2.5-hectare vineyard benefits from north-south exposure and alluvial clay soils. Hand-harvested vines, planted in 2003, preserve local grape biotypes through sustainable farming.

Bad Brothers Facón Selection

Syrah - Altos Terruñosa

FACÓN Selection Syrah 2019 comes from a historic vineyard planted in 1950 in Corral Quemado, high in Argentina's Calchaquí Valley at 2,100 meters above sea level. Grown on sandy clay soils and trained on a traditional pergola system, this old-vine Syrah is hand harvested and aged 15 months in French oak before additional bottle aging. Aromas of blackberry, strawberry, baking spices, balsamic notes, vanilla, and toffee lead to a balanced palate with remarkable freshness, elegant persistence, and a refined finish.

The Vineyards

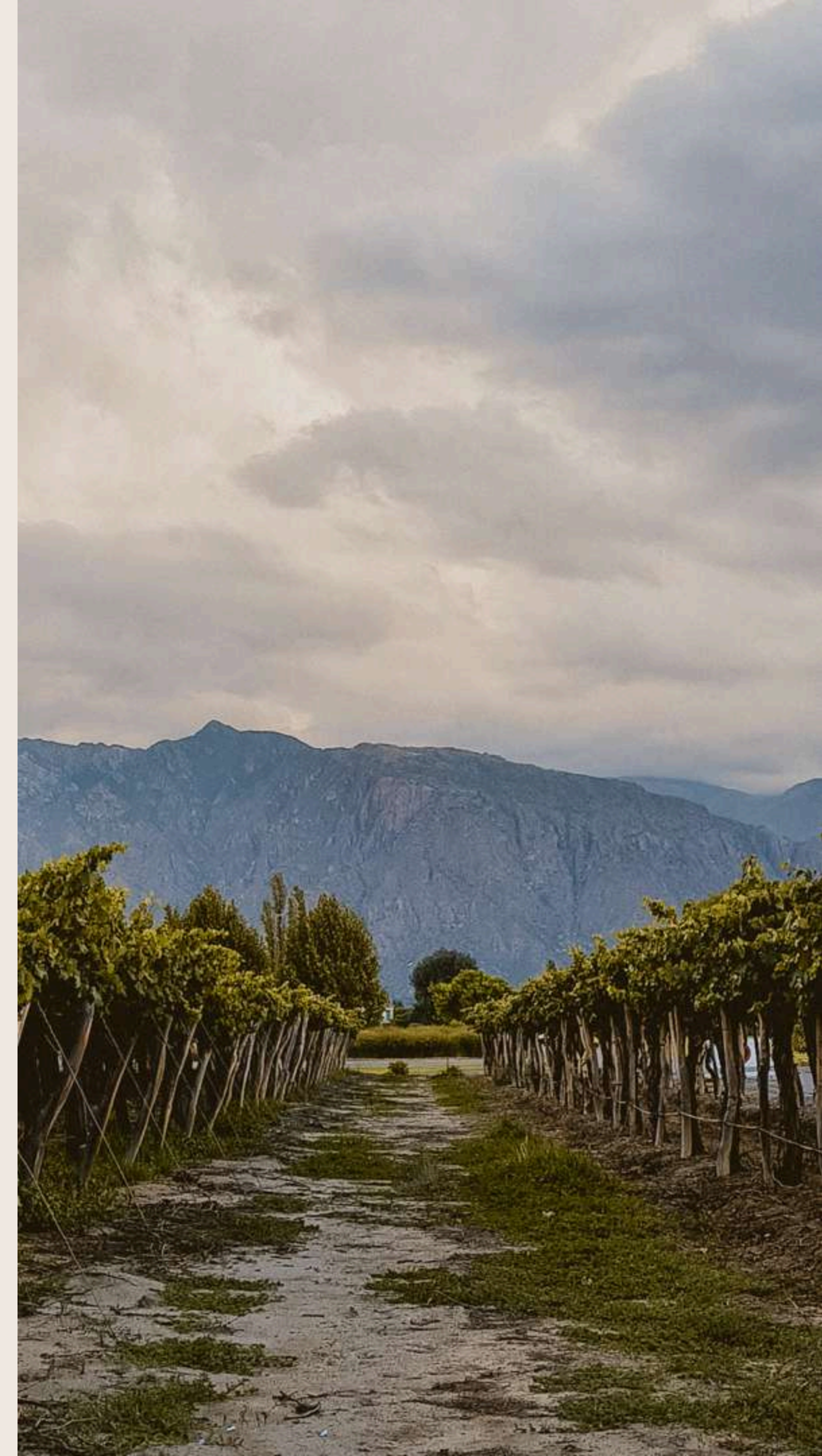
Planted in 1950 at 2,100 meters above sea level, this old pergola trained vineyard in Corral Quemado grows on sandy clay soils in the high altitude Calchaquí Valley.

Notes

- Old vines planted in 1950
- 2,100 meters elevation
- Hand harvested
- 15 months in French oak

Pair With:

Grilled ribeye, roast lamb, smoked sausages, or aged Gouda.





Vizcacha Cola de Zorro *Malbec 2021*

Vizcacha is the project of David and Álvaro Dávalos, members of the 200-year-old winemaking family behind Bodega Tacuil. This wine is full-bodied, powerful but fresh and approachable, expressing all the typicality of the Calchaquí Valley in the most traditional way: fermented with indigenous yeasts, aged without oak, and bottled within the year. Intense color, with violet reflections. Red fruit and floral notes typical of extreme altitude malbec on the nose, with a touch of spice. Full body with balanced acidity and a long finish.

The Vineyards

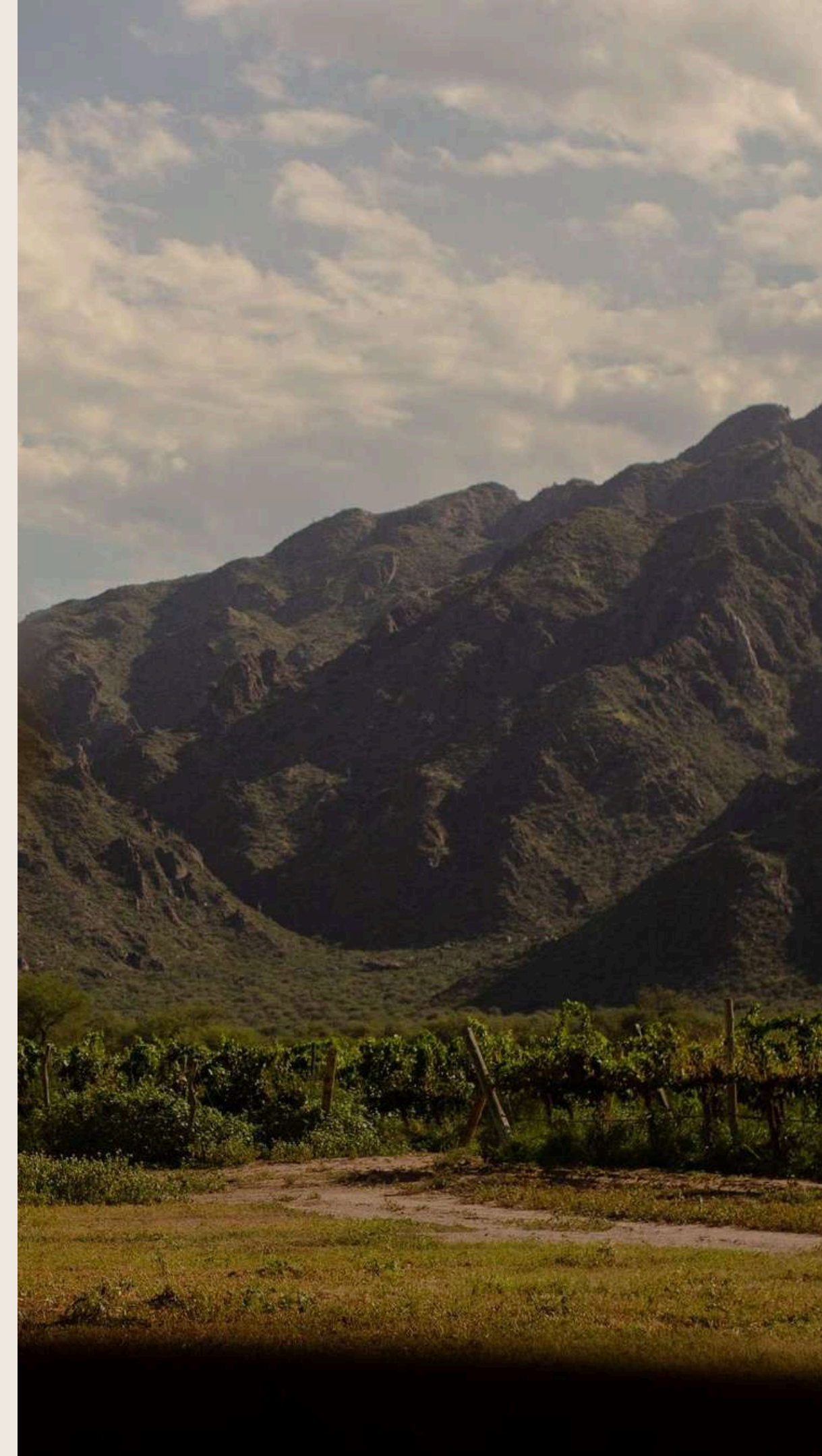
This malbec comes from a selection of different plots in vineyards located in the Calchaquí Valley, ranging from 6,800 to 8,800 feet above sea level. Extremely dry & harsh conditions, sandy soil, intense UV exposure.

Notes

- 6,800-8,800 feet
- Organic farms
- Hand-harvested
- No oak
