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Mas Vilella Red Blend 2021

Mas Vilella 2021 is made at a 16th century Catalan farmhouse that may sit atop an ancient Roman villa, where amphora and earthenware remnants have been found in the vineyard. Winemaker Albert Jané works with vines planted by his parents in 1984, continuing a family tradition that began in 1914. This wine blends Cabernet Sauvignon with Sumoll, a rare native grape of Penedès that adds earthy, distinctly Mediterranean character. Aromas of dried herbs, creamy oak, and ripe fruit lead to a palate of powerful fruit and spice. Produced organically in limited quantity, only 1,105 cases were made. Awarded multiple 90+ point scores, including 94 Falstaff and 92 Guía Peñín.

The Vineyards

Located in La Bisbal del Penedès, these organically farmed vineyards sit on poor calcareous and rocky soils under a Mediterranean climate, with low yields that favor concentration and long aging potential.

Casado Morales

EME Mazuelo 2015

Winemaker Joseba Casado's family has been making wines along the Ebro River in Rioja for a century; the modern incarnation of their Casado Morales winery dates back to the 1960s. A 100% mazuelo (known in France as carignan) is rare in Rioja. Ten years ago even they were non-existent. With this 2015 from winemaker Joseba Casado, perhaps Riojan mazuelo is ready to take first chair. In this bottle you'll find a bounty of blueberries, wild herbs, summer flowers, and spice in the nose; then a good body (not too big) on the palate, where juicy blueberry and flowers take the fore.

The Vineyards

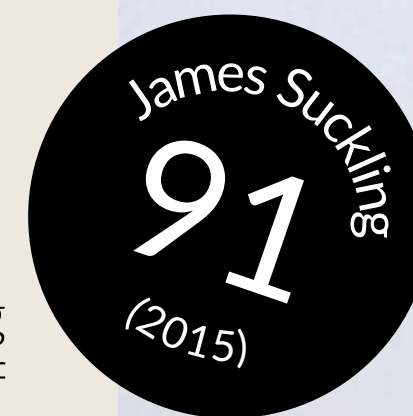
Nestled in Rioja Alavesa at 1,400 feet, the vineyard sits on lime-clay soils scattered with pebbles and gravel. This diverse terroir, combined with 32-year-old vines and traditional farming, delivers rare 100% Mazuelo with bold character and a touch of altitude.

Château Cailleteau Bergeron

Oz de Cailleteau

Oz de Cailleteau 2020 comes from Blaye, on the right bank of Bordeaux's Gironde estuary. Founded in 1933 and now run by siblings Pierre-Charles and Marie-Pierre Dartier, this family estate works with 50-year-old vines rooted in stony soils over clay and limestone. A blend of Cabernet Sauvignon and Merlot, the wine offers rich black fruit and integrated oak on the nose, followed by velvety notes of eucalyptus and tobacco on the palate. Structured yet generous, it shows the depth and character of this lesser-known corner of Bordeaux.

The Vineyards

Located in Blaye Côtes de Bordeaux, 50-year-old vines grow on stony soils over clay and limestone. The nearby Atlantic brings a cool oceanic influence that helps preserve balance and freshness.

Pair With:

Roast beef, braised short ribs, mushroom dishes, or aged cheeses.





Tacuil *Doña Ascension* 2023

Doña Ascensión 2023 comes from Tacuil, a remote corner of Argentina's Calchaquí Valley where vineyards rise to approximately 8,530 feet. Created by the Dávalos family, whose roots here span five generations, this blend combines the intensity of high-altitude Malbec with the elegance of Cabernet Sauvignon.

Aromas of blackberry, dark plum, cocoa, and subtle spice lead to concentrated black fruit, fresh acidity, and firm yet refined tannins. A structured, layered wine shaped by altitude, isolation, and tradition.

The Vineyards

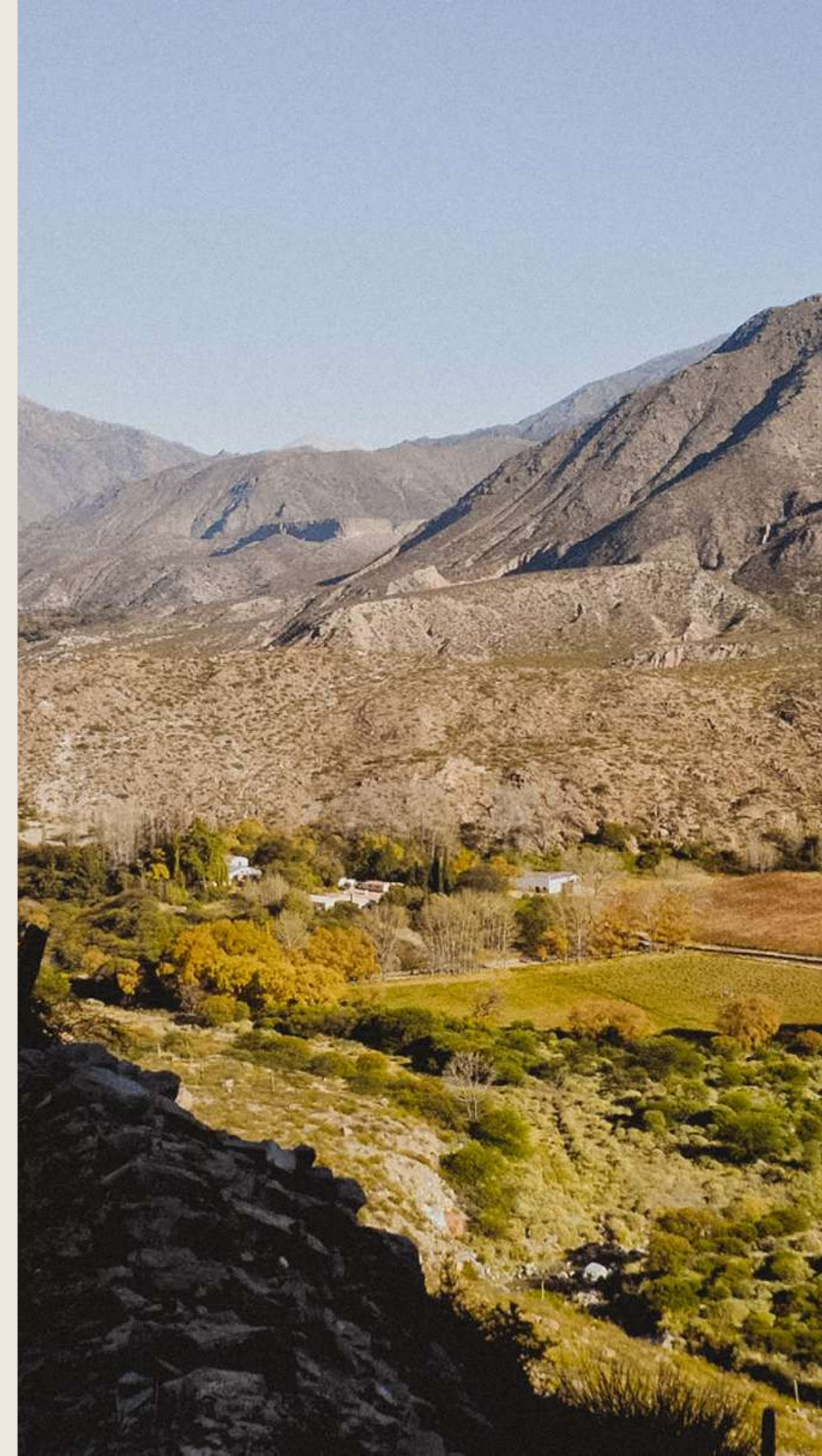
Tacuil's vineyards sit at approximately 8,530 feet in the Calchaquí Valley. Rocky, sandy soils, intense sun, and dramatic day-night temperature shifts create concentrated fruit with remarkable freshness.

Notes

- Approx. 8,530 feet
- Five generations of winemaking
- Dry-farmed vineyards

Pair With:

Grilled lamb, braised short ribs, mushroom dishes, or dark chocolate desserts.
